Are you a sports coach with a team or have other sports experience? Or do you work in HIV/Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and are interested in using football to reach young people? Could you mobilise a football team for weekly sessions? If yes, you could be a great fit to be trained as a *volunteer* TackleAfrica Football Coach Educator working with young people living with HIV through the Uganda Network of Young People Living with HIV/AIDS.



We are actively welcoming coaches living with HIV or who are affected by HIV to this programme focussing on mental health and wellbeing through football. We are recruiting for forty *volunteer* football coaches with their teams in Kampala initially to be trained in the award-winning TackleAfrica football methodology. <u>You must commit for a minimum of one year.</u>

This is a volunteer role for which you will receive

- Free football coach training one week intensive full-time training, three times a year
- Free football kit and equipment balls, bibs, cones, t-shirt, whistle, manual
- Small transport refund for sessions
- Opportunity for your team to participate in three football tournaments a year
- Opportunity to apply for future work with TackleAfrica as a Project Officer

In return you will commit to

- Attending three X one week football HIV/SRHR training courses a year and three refreshers
- Delivering thirty football sessions with your team a year
- Keeping an attendance register at each session (materials provided)
- Attending three football tournaments with your team a year
- Keeping all equipment locked and safe between sessions

You should be energetic, up for a challenge, and passionate about working with young people living with HIV to improve their mental health and wellbeing! We actively encourage coaches and educators living with, or affected by, HIV to apply. The programme will provide a stigma and judgement-free environment, as well as access to free counselling and HIV/SRHR services.
